The beautiful ceiling is finished in the kids playroom.



On January 14, over 450 participants joined us for a gorgeous day of snowshoeing and skiing at Stokely Creek Lodge for The Chocolate Express. With the sun shining and freshly fallen snow from the night before, we couldn't have asked for better weather. Together, we raised over \$11,000 for Hospice!

Gathering at the Skier's Day Cabin, participants chose either the 2.5 km Cedar Cliffs trail, the 5 km Creekside trail or the 10 km Stokely Lake Cabin trail and set off into the winter wonderland. On each trail, ARCH volunteers hosted chocolate stations, handing out delicious treats to skiers and snowshoers, including smores roasted on an open fire! Once participants returned from their trails, they enjoyed coffee, tea, hot chocolate, and Chef Erik's scrumptious, deep-fried, chocolate-dipped churros.



"The Gift" Cookbook



ICED TEA - Chef Erik Nowak

Welcome over one hundred delicious hospice recipes into your home from our kitchen to yours. Our team of volunteers and staff have graciously shared their family favourite recipes.

Hospice recipes include the following delicious options:

- Mac N' Cheese
- Lemon Chicken Rice Soup
- Bacon-wrapped Jalapeno Peppers
- Authentic Chile Con-Queso
- Gnocchi
- Peanut Butter Cup Cookies
- Pumpkin Muffins

We've provided a little taste of what can be found in our cookbook below:

A refreshing cool beverage to enjoy all year long.

1 cup of sugar 1 cup of water

4 tea bags

2 cups of boiling water 4 cups of cold water

Begin by boiling the sugar and 1 cup of water in one pot to create a sugar mixture. In another pot, boil 2 cups of water. Let first pot cool. Pour the 2 cups of boiling water over tea bags and let steep.

Remove tea bags, add sugar mixture and 4 cups of cold water.
